	FOCUS ON FENCING He competed in alpine skiing as a junior in Italy, but eventually made the choice to concentrate on fencing. "When I was a little boy, I had fencing lessons during the week while on the weekend my dad used to take me to Cavalese to ski. I tried all the [alpine skiing] disciplines allowed for my age. Maybe my family preferred me to ski and it was also the sport in which I did better, but starting a career as a professional skier would have meant moving to the mountains and I was very young and not ready for that. At 13 if you want to ski as a pro you have to constantly train, especially in super G where you have to combine technique and feeling with speed.
